### We Have to Oppose Trump's ICE Terror!

The Trump administration continues to unleash federal agents on the population, terrorizing immigrant communities across the country. ICE has arrested over people since January, and despite administration's claims, these raids are not aimed at criminals. The vast majority of people detained by ICE are low-income workers with no criminal records whatsoever. These raids serve one purpose: to terrorize immigrant workers and intimidate those who resist.

We have seen horrific videos of masked ICE agents invading apartment buildings in the middle of the night, violently arresting people in their driveways, and ripping them from their cars. They are snatching people at hospitals, courthouses, schools, and grocery stores. And in some cases, agents have rammed into immigrants' cars or fired their weapons at people in vehicles. Many families have no idea where their loved ones are after being taken by ICE. Over 20 people have died in ICE custody so far this year, as people are held in cages with little access to food, water, and medicine.

Recently, Trump threatened to send ICE and other federal agents to the San Francisco Bay Area to terrorize immigrants, and target anyone who stands in their way. At the last minute, Trump called off this deployment, as thousands of people across the Bay Area were getting ready to resist this blatant use of state violence. Trump claimed some of his billionaire friends told him his operation would cause too much disruption to their businesses. So for now, he's decided to wait.

And as the U.S. government shutdown enters its fourth week, and tens of thousands of federal workers have lost their jobs and their income, funding for Trump's agencies of terror — including ICE and Customs and Border Protection — continue at record levels. The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), known as food stamps, is expected to run out of funding as soon as next week for about 42 million people across the country. FEMA has also cut over \$11 billion in funding for disaster relief to states. But meanwhile, these agencies of terror and intimidation are able to operate without restrictions across the country, with practically unlimited budgets.

The ICE budget alone has been increased to \$150 billion between now and 2029 — which is \$37.5 billion per year.

This is bigger than the military budgets of all but 15 countries in the whole world. About \$45 billion has been allocated just to build more detention centers. They are trying to double the number of detention centers to be able to detain over 100,000 people nationwide.

The priorities of this government couldn't be any clearer. When it comes to the needs of ordinary working people, they have nothing to offer. They are cutting funding for everything we rely on, making all of our lives worse. And at the same time, they are cutting taxes for billionaires by trillions of dollars, while they amass a militarized police force to brutalize and terrorize the population.

Their detention centers are not only aimed at immigrant workers, but anyone who opposes their agenda. The Trump administration anticipates opposition from the population to their horrific policies. This is why they are working tirelessly to expand ICE and its role around the country, targeting immigrants and anyone who opposes the administration. They use immigrants as a scapegoat to blame for the problems of this system of exploitation. They unleash terror on the population, and criminalize all forms of resistance to their attacks. They are trying to construct a brutal, federal police force that can operate everywhere without any legal restrictions. Already, the vast majority of ICE arrests and kidnappings have happened without any warrants, and without any opportunity for legal challenges. There have already been over 170 instances of ICE detaining U.S. citizens. These are violent tactics clearly aimed at intimidation.

The U.S. government is trying to build up a paramilitary force to be used against the population. For now, it is primarily targeting low-income, immigrant workers. But as resistance to their policies grow, they are increasingly unleashing these shock troops on the whole population, regardless of immigration status. We can't allow their tactics to intimidate us into silence as they make our lives worse. An attack on immigrant workers is an attack on all workers. And we must continue to build up our forces to resist these attacks.

#### Politicians Are Two-Faced Hypocrites!

On October 20, Democratic Representative for Maryland Kweisi Mfume responded to his constituents who have been calling for his support about Palestine. But this time, he sent two emails with very different messages.

In one email, Mfume vouched that he has "continuously called for an immediate ceasefire" and "uninterrupted delivery of humanitarian aid," and cosponsored a funding bill for U.N. relief aid for Palestine refugees. In the second email sent to the same mailing list, he touts his cosponsoring a bill which "extends and expands crucial United States-Israel cooperation agreements" and implies that Israel's genocide is simply defense against "barbaric assault" and "terrorist threats."

Obviously, someone in Mfume's office slipped up with the email addresses, which were clearly meant for different constituents! These very different messages expose how politicians of this system function: to say whatever people want to hear while actually acting in the interests of corporate profits and maintaining power.

### Policing is No Solution to Mass Overdoses

Since July, there have been three mass overdose incidents in West Baltimore's Penn North neighborhood, totaling about 45 cases. This is a horrible situation and we know it's the tip of the iceberg. The city's chief prosecutor says that the police aren't doing their job. The Police Department says it has made 1,016 felony drug arrests so far this year, up 12 percent from 2024.

The prosecutors and cops both ignore the root of the problem—the horrible conditions of life in poverty, aggravated by systemic racism that affects health care, housing, education, food availability, job access, and more that lead people to lives of desperation and drugs. Focusing on policing is not addressing the real problem. We have poverty in the richest country in the world because it's run by billionaires who got rich exploiting the rest of us and use racist oppression to get even richer.

We live in the wealthiest country in the world, and it is our labor that has created all of this wealth. We aren't the ones who benefit from this. The super rich — the bosses of the big corporations and banks — keep the wealth and make all the decisions. Working people do the work that makes society run, and we can organize to unite our forces. When we do, we have enormous power to change things and make a better world.

#### Graduate Workers Defend Their Rights and Values

Ph.D. students at Johns Hopkins University formed a union in 2023—since then, they have not only won substantial wage raises in their contract, but have also expanded their struggle to political issues. In March, the union voted to exclude any investments in military contractors, prisons and policing, and Israeli apartheid and genocide from its internal financing plan.

In retaliation, the university administration hired a law firm famous for union busting to carry out an investigation into these internal matters of the union. When students and graduate workers held a demonstration last week to stand up for their rights to organize, university administrators followed, filmed, and harassed the students. This is an assault on people's right to organize. Graduate students are right to fight for both better pay *and* against war and genocide!

## No Kings and No Billionaires in Baltimore!

On October 18th, millions filled the streets in opposition to Trump and his reactionary agenda. Known as No Kings Day, this was one of the largest single days of protest in U.S. history. An estimated 2,500 protested in Towson, 6,000 in Columbia and 7,000 at various locations throughout Baltimore.

The demonstrations showed that many stand against Trump and his anti-worker, anti-migrant, anti-women, anti-LGBTQ+, and anti-progress goals.

Many people are energized and ready to fight back! We must continue to be engaged as workers, the force that can radically transform society. To fight for and achieve the type of world we deserve, we must see it's not just Trump, but the system of capitalism that's the problem.
